

The **Sadducees** ([Hebrew](#): צדוקים **Tzedukim**) were a group or a sect of Jews opposed to the [Pharisees](#). They were an upper-class group who looked down on the people. They controlled the Sanhedrin (the supreme Jewish court) during Jesus' lifetime. Most of them were priests but not all priests were Sadducees. They were theologically woolly; they accepted only the Pentateuch (Genesis-Deuteronomy) and denied the resurrection.

The **Pharisees** ([lat.](#) *pharisæ/us*, -i; from [heb.](#) פרושים *perushim*/פרוש *parush*, meaning "set apart") were at various times a political party, a social movement, and a school of thought among [Jews](#). They were a group of about 6000 people in Jesus' time, having originated from the Maccabean period (200 – 100 BC) as devotees of strict Jewish religious observance. They were very nationalist and anti-Roman, austere and lower middle class.

Genesis 2:24 (NIV): For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh.

According to Acts 23:8 (New International Version) "The Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, and that there are neither angels nor spirits, but the Pharisees acknowledge them all." The Sadducees try to corner Jesus by asking a tricky question in that particular subject. A woman who had been married multiple times in her life —whom would she be married to in heaven "

I think the real question to ask is; will we be married in Heaven?

From verse v34 to 36 Jesus explains that People on Earth get married but in Heaven they will neither marry nor be given in marriage. They can no longer die; for they are like the angels

Evidently, there will be no such thing as marriage in heaven. This does not mean that a husband and wife will no longer know each other in heaven. This also does not mean that a husband and wife could not still have a close relationship in heaven. What it does seem to indicate, though, is that a husband and wife will no longer be married in heaven.

Most likely, there will be no marriage in heaven simply because there will be no need for it. When God established marriage, He did so to fill certain needs. First, He saw that Adam was in need of a companion. "The LORD God said, 'It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him'" ([Genesis 2:18](#)). Eve was the solution to the problem of Adam's loneliness, as well as his need for a "helper," someone to come alongside him as his companion and go through life by his side. In heaven, however, there will be no loneliness, nor will it be any need for helpers. We will be surrounded by multitudes of believers and angels ([Revelation 7:9](#)), and all our needs will be met, including the need for companionship.

Second, God created marriage as a means of procreation and the filling of the earth with human beings. Heaven, however, will not be populated by procreation. Those who go to heaven will get there by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; they will not be created there by means of reproduction. Therefore, there is no purpose for marriage in heaven since there is no procreation or loneliness.

Most people even among Christians profess to be believers yet they act like the stories are all children's tails. They marry and are given in marriage but lack the commitment to each other which is obedience to God. Most marriages today end in divorce because there is no judgment in their perceived reality. But it also says we must seek reconciliation not only with believers but especially with our neighbours.

Heaven is different than our life here

We will be judged on how we lived here on Earth

Marriage is one of the actions that we will be judged strictly on

But in Heaven there is not man and woman as we have it on earth

The CHURCH is the bride

God is the Groom

Marriage is not for reproduction in Heaven

It is for worship

Maybe some of you got divorced because of extremely complicated situations.
